1. Introduction

The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing (HKCCPHN) was established in April 2012, as an academic, non-profit making professional organisation for promoting, protecting and ensuring the high professional standards of community and public health nursing in Hong Kong.

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6. Philosophy of Community and Public Health Nursing

- 6.1 Nursing practice is the core essence of healthcare. With the advancement of healthcare and the increasing complexity of health problems and illness pattern, there is a need of nurses with specialised and high-level knowledge and skills. The consumer era also calls for specialised and quality nursing care to safeguard and foster their health during the illness episode.
- 6.2 An Advanced Practice Nurse (APN) is defined as a Registered Nurse and/or Midwife who works both independently and in collaboration with other healthcare professionals to provide a wide range of advanced assessments and specialised interventions in response to the actual and potential health needs of the individual, groups or families. In serving the public in a continuum of healthcare service delivery, the scope of advanced practice nurse encompasses areas of health promotion and maintenance, disease prevention and management, rehabilitation, and community care in the related specialty.
- 6.3. APNs must be well supported with postgraduate education, legal protection of the title, and a clearly defined scope. It is essential that nurses strive to extend knowledge and skills to better equip them for new challenges. On this note, The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing (The College) aims to develop the Advanced Practice Certification Programme (APCP) for nurses who are committed to advancing their nursing practice in the Community and Public Health Specialty. Upon completion of this certification program, nurses who pass the Membership Certification Examination can then proceed to pursue the Sub-Specialty Modules: Community Health Nursing, Occupational Health Nursing, Primary Health Care Nursing, and Public Health Nursing. With successful completion of the Sub-Specialty program and meeting the entry criteria, the nurses will be entitled to the Fellows Hong Kong Academy of Nursing.



7.2.1. Terms of Reference

- To form examination panels in setting examination questions, launching examinations for the selection of members.
- To mark examination papers, to compile and announce examination results
- To set policies for handling appeals in alignment with HKAN's contemporary policy
- To report to the College Council

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7.2.2. Examination Panel

Examination Panel is to supervise the preparation of examination papers e.g. Multiple-Choice Questions (MCQ) and VIVA examination. To determine the assessment of the candidates is consistent with the aims and curriculum content of the Programme. The examination panel is formed when needed and to be a one-off process and to be dissolved after the examination. It is formed by 3 persons: the Chairperson of Examination Committee, one specialty Fellow and one external examiner (back up by one specialty Fellow if the external examiner is not available). The external examiner should have high academic or professional standing with relevant good experience in community and a public health profession, not necessary a Fellow of The College, a physician may be appointed whenever necessary. The appointment of external examiner is nominated by the Chairperson of Examination Committee or Accreditation Committee and endorsed by the College Council.

7.2.3. The role of the examiner (to be appointed by The College for 2 years/ term)

- a. For Multiple Choice Question (MCQ) vetting; professional experts like physician to be the external examiner for VIVA examination
- b. To review the candidates' written report and provide feedback before the scheduled Oral Presentation
- c. To attend the Oral Presentation either face-to-face / teleconferencing / online
- d. To provide input for the recommendation of the candidate's Oral Presentation

7.2.4. The duties of External Examiners are

- a. To assist The College in ensuring the Advanced Practice Certification Programme is of quality and at appropriate level
- b. To comment and give advice on assessment issues
- c. To participate in the assessment processes
- d. To make judgment on problematic cases
- e. To attend, if appropriate, the meetings of Examination Panel when candidate's assessment will be considered

Domain 1 Managing clients with complex health condition

- 1.1. Manages complete episode of care for complicated health cases and refers aspects of care to own and other professions.
- 1.2. Provides case management services to meet multiple client healthcare needs.
- 1.3. Plans and implements diagnostic strategies and therapeutic interventions to help clients with unstable and complex healthcare problems regain stability and restore health in collaboration with the client and multidisciplinary healthcare team.
- 1.4. Rapidly assesses client's unstable and complex healthcare problems through synthesis and prioritization of historically and immediately derived data.
- 1.5. Selects, may perform, and interprets common screening and diagnostic laboratory tests.
- 1.6. Diagnoses and manages acute and chronic diseases while attending to the illness experience.
- 1.7. Diagnoses unstable and complex healthcare problems utilizing collaboration and consultation with the multidisciplinary healthcare team as indicated by setting, specialty, and individual knowledge and experience.
- 1.8. Reviews medication regime and counsels clients concerning drug regimens, drug side effects, and interactions.
- 1.9. Assesses and adjusts plans for continuous management of client's health status by monitoring variation in wellness and illness.
- 1.10. Obtains specialist and referral care for clients while remaining the primary care provider.
- 1.11. Monitors client data base for follow-up, consultation, referral, and outcomes.

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Domain 2 Enhancing therapeutic nurse-client relationship

- 2.1. Demonstrates skills in promoting therapeutic interaction to effect clients' change in health behaviour.
- 2.2. Provides guidance and counselling regarding symptom management.
- 2.3. Provides emotional and informational support to clients and their families.
- 2.4. Uses human skills to enhance effectiveness of relationship.
- 2.5. Applies principles of self-efficacy/empowerment in promoting behaviour change.
- 2.6. Monitors and reflects own emotional response to client interaction and uses as data to further therapeutic interaction.
- 2.7. Facilitates staff to debrief on overwhelming emotion and grief associated with nurse-client relationship.
- 2.8. Communicates a sense of "being present" with the client.

Domain 3 Demonstrating effective leadership and teamwork

- 3.1. Coordinates human and environmental resources necessary to manage rapidly changing situations.
- 3.2. Leads hospital/community health education and promotional activities.
- 3.3. Empowers staff to assume increasing responsibilities for complicated client care with delegation, support and supervision.
- 3.4. Provides leadership in the interdisciplinary team through the development of collaborative practices or innovative partnerships.
- 3.5. Demonstrate effective leadership skills and be able to exert influence in a group.
- 3.6. Provides leadership in professional activities.

Domain 4 Enhancing quality assurance and improvement

- 4.1. Leads the on-going process of setting and revising guidelines, protocols, standards and contingency plan.
- 4.2. Develops a tracking system within the practice to ensure that clients receive appropriate preventive services.
- 4.3. Monitors peers, self and delivery system through Quality Assurance, Total Quality Management, as part of Continuous Quality Improvement.
- 4.4. Manages complaints and monitors malpractice.
- 4.5. Benchmarks various care programmes with outcome measures and advises on clinical management or recommends review of intervention as indicated.
- 4.6. Initiates and implements quality improvement strategies and clinical audits in collaboration with various health disciplines.

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Domain 5 Managing and negotiating innovative and effective approaches to care delivery

- 5.1. Employs appropriate diagnostic and therapeutic interventions and regimens for specific client groups with attention to safety, cost, acceptability, efficacy and cost-effectiveness.
- 5.2. Suggests implementation of evidenced-based practice and facilitates changes.
- 5.3. Uses evidence and rationale to leverage senior and others on decision making.
- 5.4. Contributes to the development of overall client care delivery system and adopts appropriate nursing models in system to achieve optimal outcomes.
- 5.5. Re-engineers the work process.
- 5.6. Establishes detailed implementation schedules, resources planning, achievement indicators, and monitoring mechanisms to support the service development plan.
- 5.7. Envisions change impacts. Is prepared to take reasonable risk to facilitate change and open to innovations.

Domain 6 Enhancing professional attributes of general and advanced practice

- 6.1. Applies principles of epidemiology and demography in clinical practice.
- 6.2. Promotes and fosters ethical practice and advocacy for clients.
- 6.3. Applies/develops a theory-based conceptual framework to guide practice.
- 6.4. Attains self-advancement professionally through initiating and being involved in evidence based practice and research activities.
- 6.5. Masters the application of advanced healthcare technology in specific areas and shows knowledge of the evidence found.
- 6.6. Critically evaluates and applies research studies pertinent to client care management and outcomes.
- 6.7. Applies/conducts research studies pertinent to primary care and/or specialty practice management.
- 6.8. Demonstrates expertise in area(s) of nursing. As a resource person for referrals in these areas.
- 6.9. Interprets own professional strengths, role, and scope of ability to peers, clients and colleagues.
- 6.10. Acts as a role model and sets exemplary standard of professional behaviours.
- 6.11. Supports socialisation, education, and training of novice practitioners by serving as a preceptor, role model and mentor.
- 6.12. Motivates and supports staff to be self-developing and to achieve higher professional goals.
- 6.13. Interprets and markets the advanced practicing nurse role to the public and other healthcare professionals.
- 6.14. Participates in legislative and policy-making activities which influence advanced nursing practice and health services.

9. Advanced Practice Certification Programme

9.1. The Programme

The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing aims to develop the Advanced Practice Certification Programme for nurses who are committed to advance their nursing practice in the Community and Public Health Specialty. The Education Committee is responsible for course planning and curriculum development of educational programmes with support of the Clinical Consultative Workgroup. The Clinical Consultative Workgroup is composed of Fellows of the Community and Public Health specialty. The programme would be composed of 2 parts, part 1 is a minimum of 500 hours theory in the specified specialty curriculum and part 2 is 500 hours of guided clinical practice in the related specialty.

9.2 Part 1 – a minimum of 500 hours theory learning

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9.3. Registered Nurse with 2 years post registered experience will be accepted by The College to be Associate Member (Appendix II). The Associate Member is also encouraged to take up healthcare related specialty training programmes offered by external institutions to ensure the fulfillment of the part 1 theory hours. An assessment panel will be formed to recognise structured health related specialty training programmes.

9.4. Within the 4-year periods, nurses under the Advanced Practice Certification Programme training, should undergo mentored 500 guided clinical practice hours in accredited training sites. During which, the Associate Members / Ordinary Members will work closely with the designated mentors to reflect on clinical practice and application of their specialty skills in the delivery of nursing care to the patients. The Associate Members / Ordinary Members are to complete the Clinical Log Book which served as record of reflective learning. To fulfill Part 2 of the requirement, not less than 250 hours guided clinical practice should be completed before award of the Ordinary Member. The remaining 250 hours with on-site designated mentor who is an Academy Fellow should be completed before Fellow Exit Assessment. The experience is recognised as a learning component with explicit learning objectives and evidence of learning is assessed by a recognised supervisor/mentor.

9.5. Evidence of learning components

- a. Patient pre-discharge interview and planning
- b. Handling of complicated patient episode(s)
- c. Learning progress review
- d. Reflective paper
- e. Case studies
- f. Practice project
- g. Group projects
- h. Quality improvement/patient safety activities
- i. Research project related to the specialty

9.6. Criteria of Mentors

- a. Active Fellows of The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing (HKAN) and
- b. Actively engage in the practice of nursing and
- c. Able to conduct training in accredited training programmes and

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- d. Cannot hold trainer status in more than two specialties and
- e. Received mentorship training e.g. organised by Hospital Authority, Institute of Advanced Nursing Studies (IANS), overseas university or local university in Hong Kong
- f. Cannot at the same time undergo specialty training in any other subspecialties within the Academy Colleges
- g. He or she cannot take more than 2 trainees and
- h. The Mentorship is appointed by HKCCPHN

9.7 Criteria of Training Sites:

- a. The hospital/ healthcare institution which accredited by Hospital Authority / Department of Health / Labour Department / Private hospital which recognised by college
- b. The hospital/ health-care institution is supportive to continuous learning and professional development by setting conducive learning environment.
- c. The hospital/ healthcare institution which are recognised by Nursing Council as a CNE provider.
- d. Learning resources are available such as guidelines, e-learning resources are accessible by mentee and
- e. Workload is at an optimal level to facilitate learning

9.8 Recognised Training Site (Appendix V)

The list of training sites which have been recognised and accepted by HKCCPHN. The College will visit the training sites when necessary for better collaboration to enhance the learning and development of the candidates.

9.9. Certification Examination

Upon completion of the required theory hours and clinical practice hours, and together with the completion of a Master Degree of Nursing or related discipline, the Ordinary Members are eligible to sit for the Certification Examination which is a Multiple Choice Examination.

9.10 Multiple Choice Examination

The Multiple Choice Examination paper (MCQ paper) composes of not less than 150 MCQs. The length of the examination is 3 hours.

9.11 Passing marks

The passing mark is 70% Multiple Choice Questions (MCQ) are set by Fellows of The College who have attended the MCQ workshops or who have experiences in setting examination papers or being examiners. Whenever appropriate, references are identified for each question. The MCQ examination paper is also under reviewed by the appointed External Examiners.

9.12 Examination panel

For each Certification, an Examination panel will be formed under the Examination Committee. Their roles and responsibilities are:

- Set the MCQ paper
- Validate and test the MCQ paper
- Review the marked MCQ paper
- Report the result and propose recommendations to the Examination Committee

- Worked in community and public health nursing related specialty for at least 2 years

11.2 Entry requirement to Ordinary Member:

- Completed RN/RM registration in Hong Kong with a valid practising certificate
- Accumulated 4 years of experience working in the Community and public health related specialty in recent 6 years
- Obtained a master's or higher degree in Nursing or healthcare related discipline after RN/RM registration
- Completed 500 theoretical hours in advanced practice certificate programme, with a minimum of 300 hours at postgraduate level and the remaining hours being recognised by The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing
- Completed 250 hours of # guided clinical practice at any clinical practice site recognised by The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing
 - # Guideline clinical practice includes*
 - i): Experiential learning with mentor guidance at local clinical specialty departments;*
 - ii) Practicum at work / non-work places with mentors from local clinical specialty departments under university / tertiary institution programmes*
 - iii) Practicum at work/non-work places with mentors from local clinical specialty departments under the HA PRCC Programme (only the part to be recognized by The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing)*
- Showed satisfactory performance at admission interview conducted by The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing
- Completed the self-declaration of criminal conviction or professional misconduct*

11.3 Entry requirement to Fellow Membership

- Possessed RN/RM registration in Hong Kong with a valid practising certificate
- Being an Ordinary Member of the HKAN and The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing of the related specialty
- Passed the Certification Examination offered by The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing of the related specialty
- Accumulated 6 years of experience working in the community and public health related

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specialty in recent 9 years and current 3 years must be working in the specialty applied

- Completed additional 250 hours of guided clinical practice
- Completed the clinical log-book
- Achieved 60 CNE points within the recent 3-year cycle, with 45 points relating to the community and public health related specialty
- Demonstrated significant contributions to nursing practice or service development
- Completed the self-declaration of criminal conviction or professional misconduct*
- Passed the assessment stipulated by The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing of the related specialty
- Recommended by 2 Fellows of The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing of the related specialty



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




Pathway to Fellow Membership

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
